Work experience

All of our students on vocational courses may have the opportunity to take part in some work experience in order that they begin to appreciate and experience the differing demands of the workplace. Some Level 2 and 3 courses require students to visit businesses with their group.

Making the right choices

Admissions information

Oasis Academy Lister Park is a non-selective Academy open to students of all religious faiths and those of no faith. In our sixth form application process, places will be allocated to students based on whether or not they meet the entry criteria for the sixth form as a whole and for each subject course they have chosen. Priority will be given to existing Oasis Academy Lister Park students, but we also encourage and welcome applications from external candidates who may enrich our school community.

How to apply

Step 1

Consult with your parents, teachers and friends in order to decide upon the correct programme of study for you. Remember to take careful note of the entry criteria for courses that you wish to study. Please note that the courses that you identify at this early application stage are not fixed—you may change your mind before final enrolment in the sixth form. Please note also that our course offer may be subject to change before the start of the academic year.

Step 2

If you would like to apply for a place at Oasis

Step 3

Once applications have been received, the following will happen:

- You may be asked to attend a one-to-one interview to discuss your place in our sixth form and the subject choices you have made
- You will be sent a conditional offer of a place, which is dependent on your examination results
- Successful candidates will be invited to an induction, during the summer term. The purpose of the induction will be to prepare you for sixth form life and for your sixth form subjects
