Dear Parents/Carers of Year 10, 12 and 13 Students

I hope this letter finds you well during this unprecedented time. I am writing to you today to inform you that due to staff shortage we have taken the difficult decision to ask all Year 10, 12 and 13 students to work from home for the next two weeks from Monday 9th November to Friday 20th November, returning to school as normal on Monday 23rd November 2020.

I can confirm that this is not due to high COVID cases amongst staff, so please don't be alarmed, but I would like to take this opportunity to remind you that we need to remain vigilant, both in school and in the wider community. For that reason, I have attached Public Health England's latest advice for your reference.

Please note that we are only asking your child to learn from home because we do not currently have enough staff to have them at the academy. They are not being asked to self-isolate.

The school remains open to students in Years 7, 8, 9 and 11, they must continue to attend as normal.

I know asking Years 10, 12 and 13 students to learn from home for the next fortnight may significantly inconvenience you; please rest assured that we have not taken this decision lightly.

All learning for years 10, 12 and 13 will either take place via **live lessons** for which they will receive an email invite to their school email address, or the lessons will be uploaded on **Teams**. All students have been shown how to access the live lessons and the Teams lessons. We will also be providing all year 10 students with a wallet containing writing paper and pens should you not have any available at home.

If your child in year 10, 12 or 13 is eligible for free school meals, we have a named box in reception with lunchtime food provisions for you or your child to come and collect any time on Monday 9th November from 9:00am.

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Advice – Public Health England

We know that for most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness, but we all have a responsibility to ensure that we do all that we can to reduce transmission to others.

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID 19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, you should organise for your child to be tested via the NHS online portal or by calling 119. Your household should isolate until you receive the test results giving the all clear.

Symptoms of COVID 19

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- new continuous cough and/or
- high temperature and/or
- a loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

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How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19

Do:

- wash your hands with soap and water often – do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- wash your hands as soon as you get home
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards
