In assemblies this week we have been looking at the importance of building a good reputation and the reputation of Oasis Academy Lister Park. Our reputation in the area is growing stronger; for example, did you know that:

- in the last 2 years our GCSE students have made progress faster than the national average
- last year we were in the top 12 schools of 66 in Bradford
- this year our students got grade 9s in English, Physics, Biology, Chemistry, History, Maths and RE
- this year our Post 16 students went off to universities all round the country to study Medicine, Architecture, Business. Music and more
- our academy has become more popular and grown from 700 to 1000 pupils in the last 3 years

The Breakthrough Boys Breaking Barriers!

The 'Breakthrough Boys' initiative was successfully launched on Thursday 22^{nd} September at Oasis Academy Lister Park. This exciting launch involved Mrs Ali's vertical tutor group – comprising of 30 higher ability boys in both Year 9 and 10. The event involved all the boys and their parents gathering and celebrating an initiative that will ultimately raise the aspirations, academic achievement and self-esteem of our high attaining young men.

The local and widely respected Imam Asim attended the event to talk about the importance of breaking barriers in academic life, alongside Umar Mahboob – who achieved outstanding results in his GCSE exams this year. Project manager of the group - Khateeb Khan aged 14 - used the words "exciting, positive and focused" in his speech delivered to parents and community members. The group meet every Monday at period 6 to work on Literacy and coaching linked to raising attainment.

It is very important that all students attend school every day. Missing just two days a month means a child misses out on 10% of the school year.




