Over the last few weeks, our students have been focusing hard on assessments and mock exams. It's the time when they need to be able to remember their learning, apply their knowledge to a question, sit in silence in the classroom or exam hall, manage their time for each question, have the confidence to keep going if some questions are hard, and have the stamina to keep writing at speed. That's quite a lot to think about!

We have been pleased to see our students revising and preparing for these tests with enthusiasm and a deep desire to do well. We hope they have achieved some good test results and that they can learn from what they got right and what they got wrong. Every 'mistake' is an important part of the learning journey.

Research shows that revisiting learning and frequently quizzing ourselves keeps knowledge stored in our long-term memories. We also know that deliberate practice helps us retain our knowledge and understanding. Please encourage your child to keep going back to their learning in small chunks so that they can keep this knowledge fresh.

Last week, I had the privilege of joining the student leadership group over lunch. They talked with confidence about how they learnt best and the ways we could support them in this. They were incredibly mature; sharing insight into how interactive tasks and quizzes were helping them retain their knowledge.

As teachers, we can learn so much from the students we teach. Last week, I was reminded of that once more.
